## 3. EPISCOPAL CHURCH OF THE ASCENSION ~RAFFLE PRIZE

406 W. 2ND AVENUE, PARKESBURG

This congregation, originally known as Grace Church, worshiped in Parke Hall, beginning December 3, 1865. The land at the current church location was purchased in December of 1896 and a church in the English rural Gothic style was erected. The family and employees of Parkesburg Iron Company of Horace Beale, Sr. donated the bell tower and the east side stained glass window in his memory. The first services were held in basement on May 11, 1899 and in the new church proper on October 22, 1899.

## 4. PARKESBURG BAPTIST CHURCH ~ RAFFLE PRIZE

The Baptist Church of Parkesburg began as a mission of the Glen Run Baptist Church of Atglen in 1846. The Parkesburg Baptist Church gained independence as a member of the North Philadelphia Association on May 1, 1886 at which time the Parkesburg Chapel was purchased from Glen Run. The present beautiful stone structure was built and later dedicated on April 19, 1914.

Beale Manor is the original home of John Parke. Parke's home was bought by ironmaster Horace Beale, who moved into Parkesburg to set up an iron company. Beale transformed the building in 1896 to include east and west wings and twelve fireplaces with ceramic from every continent in the world. Beale Manor currently operates as a rental venue for booking private events. Today's theme at this lovely venue is *The Nutcracker*.

#### 11. KNICKERBOCKER HOME ~RAFFLE PRIZE

529 MAIN STREET, PARKESBURG

In 1785 newlyweds John Smith and Mary Parvin Smith purchased nearly two hundred acres of land encompassing much of modern day Parkesburg. Living first in a log cabin, the couple finished their home, named "Parvin Place," with stone mined from a quarry that was located behind today's VFW. The home served as Parkesburg's first schoolhouse in the mid 1800's and as a station on the Underground Railroad during the Civil War. The Parkes joined the Smith family in establishing the first bank in Parkesburg. Remarkably, the house stayed in the Smith Family for 200 years. The Smith home and the remaining four acres of the original purchase were sold to the Knickerbocker family in 1998.

## 13. CAIRNS HOME~RAFFLE PRIZE

1208 OCTORARA TRAIL, PARKESBURG (Route 10)

Just north of Parkesburg on Route 10, the Cairns Family Farm has been recognized for exemplary farming practices by Chester County. Donald was named 2017 "Farmer of the Year." He and his wife, Kelly, invite you to step back in time as you visit their 1838 stone farmhouse. Many original elements of the home are still present. Previous owners Earl & Miriam Graybill pointed the exterior stone in the early 70s. Along with family antiques, there will also be on display pieces from Brookfield Woodworks as well as some of Kelly's Parkesburg lamps. We hope you enjoy your visit to our simply, yet festively, decorated home. Please enter through the front door and exit through the rear.

## 16. STOTTSVILLE INN ~RAFFLE PRIZE

3512 STRASBURG ROAD, COATESVILLE (Route 372)

The circa 1740 Stottsville Inn on Strasburg Road in Pomeroy is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The original inn was a log cabin built by Thomas Trueman. Trueman's Inn was replaced with a frame tavern in 1858 by David Stotts and became the Stottsville Hotel. The Stottsville Hotel/Inn has served as a full service Victorian Bed and Breakfast for 150 years. The inn has 8 guest rooms, 2 elegant dining rooms and a cozy full service bar formerly known as the Busy Bee Pub. Closed recently, the inn has undergone renovations for a grand reopening in November.

## 17. FALLOWFIELD FRIENDS MEETING ~RAFFLE PRIZE

800 DOE RUN ROAD, COATESVILLE (Route 82)

Fallowfield Friends Meeting, considered to be a center on the Underground Railroad, was originally built in 1811. Members of this Meeting became very active abolitionists. The Anti-Slavery Society met in the Fallowfield Meetinghouse until the winter of 1844 when an angry mob of anti-abolitionists disrupted one of their meetings. The Anti-Slavery group was banned from holding meetings in the building for safety reasons. In 1845 an association of abolitionists purchased land and built a meeting hall next to the Meetinghouse, which they called the Free Hall and later the People's Hall for people of all colors, creeds and political beliefs. This small village of Ercildoun also had a post office in the building across from the Meetinghouse.





## 18. PEOPLE'S HALL ~ RAFFLE PRIZE

802 DOE RUN ROAD, EAST FALLOWFIELD (Route 82)

The small hamlet of Ercildoun was very active on the Underground Railroad. An Anti-Slavery Society was formed and met in the Friends Meetinghouse next door. After a Pro-Slavery attack on the Fallowfield Meetinghouse, citizens pooled their resources and constructed the People's Hall to give the Abolitionists a place to meet undisturbed. After the Civil War, many former slaves settled in the village where the People's Hall served as a grange, church, library, town hall and housed the Fallowfield Historical Society. In 2015, the People's Hall was named to *Preservation Pennsylvania*'s List of Endangered Historical Sites.

LaMancha is scenic farm that began as an alternative to the slaughterhouse for exracehorses. Today it functions as a no-kill animal rescue that finds homes not only for horses, but also for dogs, cats, goats and the occasional exotic animal that requires more space or specialized knowledge than most animal rescues can provide. Make a point to visit to meet us and our many delightful Lamancha animals!

## 21. PRIVATE RUNNYMEDE SANCTUARY ~ RAFFLE PRIZE

304 CREEK ROAD, COATESVILLE (off Wilson Road)

In 2014, the Runnymede Sanctuary, an independent foundation, preserved 1670 pristine acres in southwestern Chester County. Situated beside the Sanctuary Office is the Moses Ross House, an L-shaped brick building in the vernacular Greek Revival style. It was built circa 1850 by Milton Jefferis, who obtained 94 acres here in 1849. Moses Ross purchased the property later for \$8,000 and it stayed in his family until 1914. The house, listed on the National Historic Register, was pictured in Futhey and Cope's History of Chester County (1881) and is undergoing renovations. The privately-owned Runnymede Sanctuary has graciously agreed to open its property and office on December 2nd for those on the 2017 Christmas in Parkesburg Town and Country Tour. Stop to enjoy the beauty, nature and history that abound on this spectacular sanctuary property!

## 22. FRIENDSHIP UNITED METHODIST~11-1~RAFFLE PRIZE

123 EAST FRIENDSHIP CHURCH ROAD, COATESVILLE

Come explore this beautiful country church which was established in the small village of Gum Tree in 1830's. The historic graveyard for the church is directly across the street. Friendship United Methodist Church, actively involved in the Parkesburg Churches Outreach—PCCO, will welcome those on the Christmas in Parkesburg Tour during the **hours of 11 am to 1 pm**.

## 23. LASATA HORSE FARM ~RAFFLE PRIZE

10 ABBOTT LANE, COATESVILLE (off Friendship Church Road)

The Lasata Horse Farm has been in operation since 2010 providing quality horsemanship services and education. This beautiful facility provides balanced seat riding instruction and camps for beginner through advanced riders, including those with disabilities. Stop by to see this beautiful facility and meet the Lasata horses and staff!



## 24. STONE SPRING SURI ALPACA FARM ~ RAFFLE PRIZE

18 MCHENRY RD, COCHRANVILLE (off Friendship Church Road)

Stone Spring Suri Farm is owned and operated by Joe and Teresa Maxwell, who moved alpacas to this location in 2012. The herd is currently 19 and counting.
